

With a stable skilled workforce, lower operating costs and plenty of room to expand, Albury Wodonga is your gateway to growth.








Our connected location


Our workforce is your advantage





Albury Wodonga Regional Hospital Redevelopment (\$558 million)

Inland Rail (\$403.5 million)


Manufacturing
